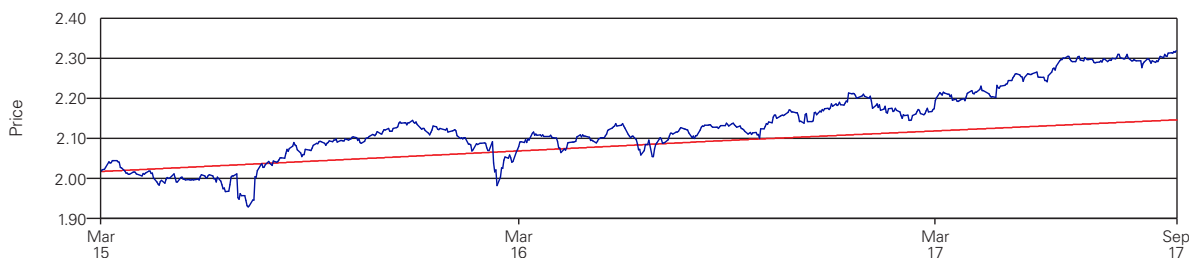

market commentary

Most global bonds posted positive returns in the third quarter of 2017, with corporate bonds outperforming government bonds. The decline in crude oil prices and geopolitical tensions surrounding North Korea led to a risk-off stance in markets and US Treasury yields fell. However, yields began to edge higher, partially due to US President Trump's tax reform plan, which raised concerns about an increase in the Federal deficit. Additionally, at its policy meeting in September, the US Fed signalled its intention to raise interest rates in December. In Europe, bond yields initially fell in line with US Treasuries. However, the positive sentiment was slightly offset towards the end of the period as the ECB singled out currency volatility as a source of uncertainty that required close monitoring and said that it would retain its accommodative monetary policy.
